Punctuality

We are concerned about the number of children who are repeatedly late for school. It is not acceptable for children to arrive after 8.50am when lessons have started. It disrupts the start of the day for children who are arriving late and for those already engaged in their learning. We are now asking for the parents of those children who arrive late to explain the reason for this and

complete a late form on arrival at main reception. This requests information about reason for lateness, time of arrival and lunch order (if necessary).

Due to the interruptions to learning, should you arrive late, we will expect you to remain in main reception with your child until there is a suitable break in lessons for your child to go down to class.

Come along for a morning of games, craft activities, and a tasting menu, plus the chance to tour our Children's Unit and meet some of our friendly hospital team.


This is a great opportunity to learn more about our Children and Young People's services, which provide inpatient and outpatient care for ages birth to 18 years.
